Camp Kinneywood Information

What to wear: Shorts or pants, sneakers or shoes with socks (this cuts down on stubbed toes, bug bites and poison ivy). NO Sandals or Jelly Shoes! On rainy days bring rain gear and on cooler days bring a jacket or sweatshirt. Be prepared for all weather conditions.

What to bring: Bathing suit and towel are a must (unless there is a note from parent saying the child is not to go swimming), a plastic bag for the wet things, a hat, sunscreen. What not to bring: Do not send your child with any spending money; there is nothing at camp to buy (unless notified). Do not bring any valuables such as cd players, cell phones, walkman, toys or cards.

Send your child with things that are okay to get dirty. Try to send them with a towel you won't miss and clothing that is okay to play in.

Lost and Found: Please..Please...Please put your name on everything! Every year I send at least 12 bags of clothing to the Salvation Army. We hold up lost and found items every afternoon at flag yet we still have many things not claimed. We will continue to hold up clothing on a daily basis but it would be great if you had your child's name in all of his/her items. We will hold things at camp for 2 weeks and then if there is no name on the item, we will throw them away. All socks and underwear not claimed at flag get thrown away on a daily basis.

What is the CIT Program?

It is a leadership-training program from youth 13-15 or finishing 7th-9th grades.


Structure and Participant Requirements:

- CIT is designed to be a 2-3 year program consisting of 360 hours of training.
- Training consists of both classroom lecture and activities as well as direct work with younger children. They will be evaluated on both levels.
- Once the 360 hours are completed and the participant maintained a **B+** or better throughout the CIT training, they will then be eligible for a \$50 week stipend.
- Participants are evaluated and graded on knowledgeable and skills learned by the program's director. A "**B**" average is required in order for a participant to

progress in the program. The program director will work with struggling participants on their grades. Participants are expected to have their parents informed on their progress.

- Cost \$100 per week. Optional bus transportation available.
